



## THE INSTITUTE OF LAW CLERKS OF ONTARIO INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY FELLOWSHIP COURSE

**The Institute of Law Clerks of Ontario**, is offering the Intellectual Property Fellowship course (“IPF”). This advanced level course covers the following concepts: copyright (works protected, rights protected, infringement, etc.); trade-marks (types, scope of protection, registration, etc.); patents (patentable inventions/subject matter, criteria, application process, infringement, etc.); other forms of intellectual property, enforcement, remedies and commercialization of intellectual property.

**The IPF course instructor is Lisa Trabucco.** Ms. Trabucco graduated from the University of Windsor, Faculty of Law, in 1991 and was called to the Bar in Ontario in 1993. In 2002, Ms. Trabucco earned an LL.M. in Intellectual Property law from Osgoode Hall, York University. Ms. Trabucco has practiced primarily in the area of civil litigation with a concentration in intellectual property law for several years. Ms. Trabucco has previously taught the IPF course and received high praise from her students.

**The course will run for 14 weeks** and will consist of lectures supplemented by written material. Students will be evaluated on the basis of one final examination.
